



## TWHF - Make Your Own Heritage Trail

### How to Submit Your trail

Step 1 – Write your trail in editable text format- either Microsoft Word or just in the body of an email. *Please do not send in PDF Format.*

Add in text to indicate where photographs will sit in your trail  
Eg 'Photo 1' or 'Photo A'

#### [Photo 1]

This trail explores my local area in a small part Le Havre docks. The docks themselves can be both striking and engaging, if you know where to look. The city was built in the XVI<sup>th</sup> century around its port, and therefore has many intriguing historical artifacts - but it is also very much still active, as one of the largest ports in Europe, so historical conservation often has to make way to everyday practicality.

#### [Photo 2]

Just down the road, we go past "La Maison du Marin" (the sailor's house), a wonderfully historic building that used to house passing sailors in the XX<sup>th</sup> century. As time went on, it was used less and less and fell into disrepair. After a few failed renovation projects, it recently got renovated into modern flats, while keeping its original outside aesthetic.

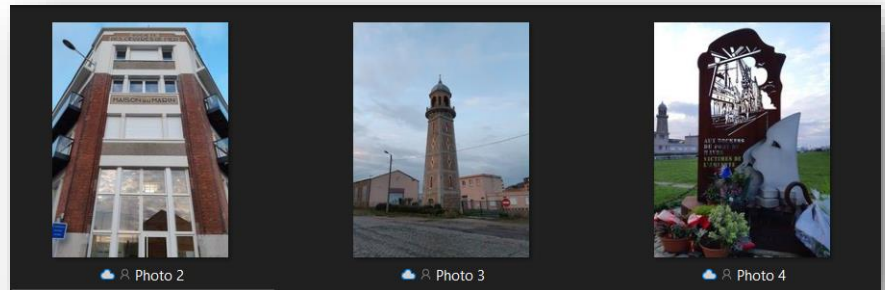
As we continue on towards the dockyard, we find "La Tour Des Dockers" (the Longshoreman's Tower). This imposing construction, from around the same time period, houses a clock that used to ring 14 times a day, punctuating the workday from 6.30am to 11pm.

As we continue along, we find an unfortunately more haunting artwork. This memorial to the dockworkers who suffered from asbestos poisoning; a grim but powerful reminder of the tough working conditions experienced by local workers, the fresh flowers showing us the recency of events we like to consider being far in the past.
